

# Level 3 - Specialist Short Breaks for Children and Young People with Additional Needs and Disabilities

# For Families and Social Workers October 2024



#### **Eligibility for Specialist Short Breaks**

#### 0 – 18 years, may extend to 25 years if there is an assessed need for services to continue

Sometimes a child or young person may have more significant or complex needs due to their disability and will need more specialist support than what is available via universal or targeted services. To identify if there is a need for specialist Short Breaks a social worker will undertake an assessment which will consider the following:

- The identified needs are as a direct result of the child's disability i.e are not due to family dynamics or economic resources
- The degree of care, supervision and support required to meet their needs are much greater than that usually required to meet the needs of children and young people of the same age
- The identified needs cannot be met in any other way through universal, targeted or family support/provision

The assessment will include a minimum of one home visit by an allocated social worker. Checks with other health, care and education professionals involved with the child/young person and their family will also be undertaken.

During the assessment, the social worker will work with the family to identify what support is needed. This could be referrals to other agencies that can offer specialist advice and support or this could be in the form of a funded package of support. Any identified funded package of support will be presented to the Children with Disabilities Multi Agency Panel for consideration.

The support provided may include one or a number of services such as; a personal assistant, support in the family home, specialist group/club provision, overnights away from the family home. These services will be commissioned specifically for the child's/young person's needs or alternatively a family may choose to take a Direct Payment to arrange the services themselves.

Any services provided will be regularly reviewed in line with the child's needs. This means that support can increase, decrease or cease.

#### **Children and Young People's Continuing Care**

Some children and young people (up to age 18), may have very complex health needs and may be eligible for continuing care.

These may be the result of:

- congenital conditions
- long-term or life-limiting conditions
- disability
- serious illness or injury

The Integrated Care Board (ICB) has responsibility for assessing children and young people to see if they need a package of continuing care. A referral can be made by any health professional, social worker or carer who feels a continuing care package may be required. When a child or young person is referred for an assessment, the ICB might first check if they are likely to need a full assessment.

A health assessor will then collect evidence of the child's needs, drawing on the advice of health and care professionals. An important part of the assessment is to capture the preferences of the child or young person and their family. The assessment will look at the current care being provided but a decision on whether or not a child or young person has a continuing care need is based on the nature of their needs, rather that the care available, or whether or not they have a particular condition.

The health assessor will make a case to a panel of experts, who decide based on the evidence, and the recommendation, if the child or young person has a continuing care need.

Depending on the decision, a package of care is then agreed; some of this care may be provided through existing services such as Short Breaks; some may need to be specially arranged.

#### **Direct Payments**

If the Children with Disabilities Multi Agency Panel agrees, you may choose to have some or all of your child's care and support costs paid to you as a Direct Payment. A Direct Payment enables you to make decisions about the provision of care and support such as employing a personal assistant.

There are lots of advantages to employing someone to help with your child's care and support, but being an employer is a big responsibility and there are lots of things to consider.

# Baysdale Short Breaks Service Tees and Esk Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust



Baysdale provides short break respite care to children and young people with learning disabilities and associated healthcare needs. Baysdale is located at Roseberry Park Hospital in Middlesbrough and can be accessed by children and young people that live in Teesside.

Staff are trained to care for children with complex physical health needs such as gastrostomy feeding, as well as providing a stable and predictable environment for autistic children and young people and those with ADHD.

Eligible children and young people will be offered 2 overnight stays per month.
